THE ILLINOIS SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER

SBDC at SVCC was established in 2017 as part of a statewide Illinois SBDC network initiative. Along with the support of the Sauk Valley area counties, cities, banks, and community organizations, Sauk Valley Community College entered into a cooperative agreement and received grant funding from the Small Business Administration and Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to establish the SBDC Center on the campus of Sauk Valley Community College.

SBDC offers no-cost advising to individuals and businesses who are seeking assistance with business development. The Center advises entrepreneurs and small businesses at all stages of business development, including conceptualization and feasibility, business startup, growth and expansion, and business exit and succession planning.

SBDC offers professional training and workshops that are designed and delivered by subject matter experts in the Sauk Valley area. Workshop topics range from those relevant to startups to those needed by experienced business professionals. The Center even offers multiple on-demand free workshops that can be accessed at any time.

Deb Proctor established *The Barkery on Science Ridge LLC* with the dream of providing luxury kennel suites, play areas, and training spaces for all dogs in the Sauk Valley area who need a temporary place to stay. Their slogan "*The Place to Stay when Family's Away*" exemplifies the idea that her building and space caters to a small, home-like setting for dogs to feel cared for and safe while their family is away. The Barkery on Science Ridge LLC is a newly constructed building with all considerations and amenities directly focused on providing a luxury kennel experience for dogs and their owners.

CHALLENGE: Deb Proctor came to the Illinois SBDC at Sauk Valley Community College back in 2017 looking for assistance on how to build her luxury kennel space as well as how to properly establish her business in Illinois, create a formal business plan, and obtain financing.

HOW ILLINOIS SBDC HELPED:

The Center and her advisor have helped in numerous areas, such as business licensure, obtaining an FEIN, establishing tax accounts, creating several comprehensive business plans with financial projections, zoning, building and construction budgeting, market research, and operational planning.

RESULT: Deb Proctor was able to start and build her business and will officially open in July 2022. When reflecting on her experience of working with Justin at the Illinois SBDC, she said, "It has been an exciting and growth-filled journey. Thank you, Justin and the Illinois SBDC, for guiding and supporting me along the way."

The SVCC Impact Program will harness the collective power of Sauk Valley partners and communities to create an effective, supportive, sustainable path for students to pursue a college education and achieve career success through lifelong learning, public service and economic advancement. SVCC's earned-tuition program provides eligible students, who graduate within the Sauk Valley Community College district, the opportunity to earn tuition and fees for up to three years at SVCC, or until they earn their certificate or degree— whichever comes first. Students need to complete the following five criteria to be eligible for the Impact Program,

 Register for the program by September 1 of their freshman year of high school

2 Graduate on time or early from an in-district high school or homeschool program

3 Participate in 100 hours of community service before high school graduation (25 hours per year)

4 Apply for at least one other local/state/national scholarship

5 Complete the FAFSA

Since April 27, 2022, 772 students representing every in-district high school as well as homeschooled students have signed up for the SVCC Impact Program. Since June 1, 2022, Impact students have volunteered over 5,000 hours! Additionally 121 organizations have signed up to be a volunteer partner requesting nearly 500 volunteers each month at about 90 individual events.
