Distinguished Alumni Award

Honorary Degree in Applied Science

the first female warden of an all-male institute at the Dixon Correctional Facility until 1986, she transitioned to the position of Associate Professor of Criminology at SVCC. After receiving her degree in law, she served as the Lee County States Attorney from 2000-2004 and practiced law with her husband, Henry Dixon. "I am deeply grateful to receive this degree. I never imagined who or what would shape my life, and I hope to continue to shape the lives of those who cross my path. She encouraged the graduates to "shine your light; it is a gift you have to share."

The SVCC Impact Program continues to show strong engagement across participating students and nonprofit partners.

SVCC Impact Program Update

We are less than a year away from welcoming our first Impact students on campus to begin their journey of working towards a certificate or associate degree from Sauk Valley Community College!



Parents and students have reported positive outcomes from the program. Students indicated they gained valuable social, leadership, and community service skills. Parents noted that the program helped their children become more active in the community and bolstered their confidence and college readiness. Progress has also been made in the Foundation's efforts to secure the necessary funding to create a permanent endowment for this Program.

Beginning in the summer of 2023, the Foundation launched small-town challenges in Polo and Ashton/Franklin Grove to secure funds for the Impact students in these communities. The response from community members has been great, with over \$600,000 in gifts and pledges received so far. More small-town challenges are planned for 2024-25 and beyond to ensure that all Impact students within the district are fully funded.

A Legacy Gift of over \$390,000 was received from the Ruth and Stan Mitick Trust. Lifelong residents of Morrison, Ruth, and Stan were civic-minded individuals who volunteered for many local community projects. Ruth, a teacher for over 30 years, and Stan, an engineer with General Electric in Morrison, understood the importance of education. Their gift to the Foundation was just one of many provided to educational institutions throughout the Sauk Valley area.

Now is the time.

With only 30% still needed of the \$10 million goal, now is the time to give to ensure that the Impact students in your community are fully funded.

2024 Endowment Report

On November 4, 1965, the Sauk Valley College Foundation was officially incorporated with the State of Illinois as a not-for-profit corporation "operated exclusively for educational purposes to assist in. . . the educational functions of Sauk Valley Community College." We are in awe of the vision and foresight of the original 14 Board members to realize the importance of establishing the foundation from the very beginning of the College.

The Foundation is now comprised of 13 volunteer Board members who live within the College district. They assist with developing relationships and capital that support the college's initiatives and provide scholarships and other forms of support to SVCC students.

The Sauk Valley College Foundation has earned a 96% rating for cost effectiveness and overall health of our programs from Charity Navigator, a free, independent organization that evaluates US-based charities and provides resources to help people support causes they care about.

Endowment Overview


The Foundation maintains 62 endowed funds designated by donors for specific purposes such as scholarships, program support, and capital improvements.

As of June 30, 2024, the Foundation had received endowment gifts totaling \$971,772 from donors.

\$288,587 as pledge and recurring gift contributions

A total of \$106,573 was awarded in endowed scholarships and assistance to students during fiscal year 2024.
